

Meeting with the Principal Advisor (P&A), Prasar Bharati

Meeting with the Principal Advisor (Pers. & Admin.) Prasar Bharati by ARTEE President.

Slow Progress of Proposals on three Core issues in DG (AIR): ARTEE President met Principal Advisor (PA), Prasar Bharati to pursue the forwarding of the proposals from DG(AIR). President expressed his disappointment about the slow progress of Proposals. The Principal Advisor immediately conveyed DG (AIR) and E.in.C.(AIR) to expedite the process. At present ACP Patna and One Cadre One Pay proposals have reached Prasar Bharati.

Meanwhile Draft Minutes of PB Board Meeting dated 08/7/14 are ready and efforts are on that it is approved at the earliest and Proposals are forwarded to the Hon'ble Ministry as early as possible.

Issue of Merger of EAs and SEAs: The issue discussed with explaining its sensitivity. It was conveyed that any efforts towards derogatory Merger in 4200 GP is not at all acceptable and Since there shall be no Engg.Asstt in 4200 GP after the implementation and generalization of One Cadre One Pay issue, the Merger should be in 4600 GP only. The Principal Advisor (P&A) assured to look in to this matter and instructed Sh. Ashok Kumar, Consultant to look into the issue.

Transfer Policy: President expressed ARTEE's concern and emphasized that issue needed to be discussed very seriously and in detail, since it is related to our Career and service. Brig. Vishwanathan, ADG(A), PB who was also present assured to discuss the issue with Association in detail.

Inclusion in 7th CPC : Principal Advisor (P&A) assured to send a reminder to 7th CPC on the subject.

Slow Progress of Cadre Review: ARTEE expressed its concern over slow progress of Cadre Review Exercise. It was noted and to expedite the issue.

Hurdles in Clearing the Retiring Benefits: It was conveyed that Chennai and Nagpur PAO are creating problems and refusing to accept the Orders of Prasar Bharati. The Principal Advisor (P&A) instructed the ADG (F) to look into the Matter.
