Respected sir,

Vide this Letter, we once again remind your good self about the inordinate delay in release of Difficult Station Transfer Lists from South Zone, which has led to totally avoidable suffering. We regret to inform you that last month, some Difficult Station Tenure staff completed more than three years at their Station.

As we brought to your notice in our last Letter, the zonal authorities are claiming that the 16th July 2020 instructions issued by Prasar Bharati not to post staff to LPT / DMC / PGF is causing the delay in issuing transfer orders. They are yet to receive a reply from Prasar Bharati to their query of August 2020, whether replacement staff could be posted to these places.

This delay is not only causing dejection and frustration among the Difficult Station staff waiting for transfer. It is also delaying the medical cases and general transfer lists which are usually released in April-May every year. This delay is most unjustified and distressing.

Hence, we once again request your good self to expeditiously clarify the matter to ADGSZ and ask them to release the Orders without further delay. In case it is not possible to clarify it immediately, ADGSZ may kindly be asked to release at least that portion of the difficult station transfer list which is not affected by this query/clarification.

We also once again request you to post employees in LPTs/ PGFs where there is severe shortage. As you are aware, some LPTs are presently running with a staff strength of 2 or 3, in spite of round-the-clock transmission. Earlier, at least 5 staff used to work there. As a result, the incumbent staff are forced to do double duty almost daily, without any chance of Compensatory Off. Posting sufficient number of staff would be the only solution for this issue.
